

Job Title - National MSL Director Location – Remote – 40-60% travel

We are hiring a National Director who will build, train, mentor and lead our Medical Science Liaison (MSL) team. Key Responsibilities of the role:

- Identify gaps in ECP education and clinical evidence; propose ideas on how to address unmet educational and evidence needs. Serve as a presbyopia disease state and product expert and be able to provide strategic input into educational initiatives and product launch plans.
- Stay current on Presbyopia scientific literature and market and maintain adequate communication on KOL engagement and opportunities for disease state education and awareness.

- Doctorate degree required: OD (Doctor of Optometry) or (MD/DO (Ophthalmology).
- A minimum of three (3) years of work experience of which two (2) must be in eye care medical affairs, a minimum of two (2) years as a medical liaison and one (1) year managing a field-based medical team.
- Flexibility in adapting/reacting to changing market dynamics and competitive challenges. Tolerance for ambiguity and the ability to be flexible within the work environment. High sense

of urgency and commitment to excellence in the successful achievement of objectives. Excellent planning and organizational skills to demonstrate leadership and initiative.
